

# Monet & Giverny

Impressionism has long been associated with Paris, but there are many links and connections with the nearby region of Normandy, especially thanks to Monet's love of the area. Having spent much of his childhood in Le Havre and the last 40 years of his life in Giverny, many of Monet's most famous paintings are of Norman landscapes. Indeed, his painting *Impression, Sunrise* of the Normandy coast gave rise to the term 'Impressionism'. On this tour, you will track the Impressionist heritage through the region, including Giverny, Rouen and Honfleur.

#### Itinerary

Day 1: Sunday 24 May 2026 Travel by coach from Ashford to Dover to make the ferry crossing to Calais. On arrival continue to Rouen and check in to the Radisson Blu Hotel. This evening enjoy a welcome drink and dinner with wine at the hotel.

#### Day 2: Monday 25 May 2026

Morning visit to the pretty port of Honfleur and Musée Eugene Boudin which documents the artistic appeal of Honfleur and the Seine estuary. Free time for lunch (own expense). In the afternoon visit Rouen's excellent Musée des Beaux Arts that houses a wonderful collection including Monet's *Rouen Cathedral* and works by Boudin and Dufy. Dinner with wine at a local restaurant.

#### Day 3: Tuesday 26 May 2026 A full day in Giverny today with visits to Monet's House and Gardens, home



to his beloved lily pond and the Musée des Impressionnismes, home to a series of exhibitions dedicated to Impressionism. Monet's love affair with Giverny started in 1883 when he rented a house here with his family, using the barn as a studio and the surrounding landscapes as inspiration. In 1890 he was able to buy the house and spent the following years, and increasing wealth, creating his gardens, through careful instruction to, eventually, seven gardeners. Return to Rouen for evening at leisure.

Day 4: Wednesday 27 May 2026 Morning departure from Rouen for the return transfer to Calais. En route we will visit the Agapanthe Gardens close to Dieppe for a private tour. Designed by landscape architect Alexandre Thomas, the garden is in two parts and is known for its unique and evolving design. Return to Dover by ferry and coach.
